PASTOR'S PEN

Specials in February

It is amazing when we look at the calendar to see all the things that this country celebrates. February has a lot of special dates. The 2nd is Groundhog Day. Not a day affecting national security but one that gets a lot of attention. {The last time I celebrated Ground Hog's Day was when I caught the one that had burrowed under my barn and made quite a mess. The groundhog however was not celebrating.} The 12th is Lincoln's Birthday. I don't know about you but I usually don't send him a card. Next comes Valentine's Day; a day of many meanings. We talk about love and cupid on that day but also are reminded of the St. Valentine's Day Massacre on Chicago's north side on February 14, 1929. Here comes the 20th with President's Day, get your cards out again. These specials are followed by Washington's Birthday on the 22nd (what is with all the Presidents thing?). Also, Ash Wednesday is on the 22nd.

The thing I find interesting in February is the fact that we find love and repentance in the same month. Saint Valentine's Day, commonly shortened to Valentine's Day, is an annual commemoration held on February 14 celebrating love and affection between intimate companions. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of this forty day liturgical period of prayer and fasting leading up to Easter. Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of adherents as a sign of mourning and repentance to God.

In reality every day should be a day to celebrate love and affection and also every day should be a day to of practicing repentance. Repentance — being sorry for and turning away from our wrongdoing (sin). You see love leads to repentance. When we hurt someone we love, we are sorry for what happened and want to get back in right standing. If we don't care, we are revealing that love is not present (a dangerous place to be).

When we love God, when we sin against Him, it is our love for Him that leads us to repent. Then repenting leads to right standing and love is restored. It works the same for relationships between people. Love leads to repenting and repenting leads to greater love. The Bible has a lot to say about both love and repentance. Proverbs 10:12 Hatred stirs up dissension, but love covers over all wrongs. Proverbs 17:9 He who covers over an offense promotes love, but whoever repeats the matter separates close friends. I Peter 4:8 Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins.

Love covers a multitude of sins. Interesting it doesn't say who's sins: mine or the one I am loving. If I love someone will that cover up his/her sins or mine. Perhaps herein is the answer. When I love someone deeply, my love for them becomes greater than the sins I can see in them. They are covered up in love, the sins become miniscule. Likewise when I love deeply as God says I should, my sins are covered up in Him. God loved us deeply enough that He blotted out, covered up, all of our transgressions by the blood of Jesus. Shouldn't we then, love each other deeply enough to blot out their transgressions against us.

Peter Summed it up in I Peter 1:22: "Now that you have purified yourselves by obeying the truth so that you have sincere love for your brothers, love one another deeply, from the heart."

P.S. - I don't know what to tell you to do with the Groundhogs and the Presidents.


something outside our "comfort zone." Several enriching conversations followe
