

Forty Days Later

This month we celebrate the Death, Burial and Resurrection of the Savior, the Exalted One, the Anointed One, the Son of God, the one and only Lord Jesus Christ. He went thru all that he went thru that our sins may be forgiven and that thru His sacrifice we might attain to the resurrection of the dead and live with Him and for Him in Eternity. Hallelujah, Praise the Lord! But He didn't just save us to keep us from hell and get us into heaven; His top priority while we are here on earth is to shape us into the image of His Son (Rom. 8:29). Being "Born Again" is not the end it is the beginning. Just as when our children are born, it is not the end, but just the beginning. The goal is to train them up in the way they should go, to raise spiritually healthy young adults that will grow into spiritually healthy senior adults.

Acts Chapter 1 gives us a little insight into the 40 days that Jesus walked this earth after His resurrection. (v3 After his suffering, he showed himself to these men and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God.) All that Jesus said is important; He did not waste one word He spoke here on this earth. But we should pay special heed to some last words.

In verses 4& 5 He instructed to wait for the promise of the Father, the Holy Spirit. On the Day of Pentecost the Holy Spirit was given as a gift unto all men. Prior to the Day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was sent to individuals only as God saw fit. Now when we are saved, born again God "set(s) His seal of ownership on us, and put(s) His Spirit in our hearts as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come". (II Cor 1:22). What a great deal He has given us. Verse 8 He (Jesus) tells us that: "(1) you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and (2) you will be my witnesses".

If the Church (the body of believers, both in our building, community and world wide) of Jesus Christ is going be what Jesus is calling us to be, we must witness. I have heard it said many times: "Oh, I'm not good at that, let someone else do it". "It's hard for me to talk to people about that stuff." "Well you know, you should never talk to people about religion and politics". While it has been debated about the politics, it is a sure thing we should not talk to people about religion. We SHOULD however talk to them about Jesus.

You see after all He has done for us, we should not be able to stop talking about Him. Besides that Jesus didn't say: "you might be my witnesses", He said "you shall be". You see there is no excuse not to. He did not go through all He went through for us to sit around the church (building) and wait for Him to return. There is much work to do and many people to reach.

Are you a little weak in the witnessing area. Let me give you some encouragement. Go take your phone off the hook, "turn off your cell phones and other electronic devises until the pilot (God) gives you the ok to turn them back on". Get in your closet and tell God your weak areas and "wait on the promise from the Father". He, God, will give you the power, the Holy Spirit, to do what He has called you to do. Trust Him. I know, some are thinking: "I can't turn off my cell phone". Aw, go on, give God a chance, live on the edge, turn it off. Trust Him. See what God will do.

After you have received power He simply tells us as He did the man from the Isle of Gadara in Luke 8:39 "Return home and tell how much God has done for you."


