
# My Hero

# PASTOR'S PEN

# Nothing Stays The Same

Science tells us, as well as our own human experiences, nothing stays the same. The word to describe this is "dynamic: characterized by constant change, activity or progress." We ourselves cannot even remain the same, with each passing breath we change, our molecules change, and our thoughts change. Change is a given, it will happen.

Charles Darwin came up with a theory about that change that has rocked the secular world for years. His theory was that in that change monkeys were evolving, or changing into human beings. **Evolve: to produce by natural evolutionary processes**. In essence monkeys found a need to walk upright and become men. The theory is bogus very easily on two counts. 1) The bible says God created man from the dust of the earth. 2) If monkeys became human beings, why aren't monkeys still becoming human beings?

God speaks in His word of another process of change. **Transform: to cause to change in potential, to cause to undergo genetic transformation.** He tells us in Romans 12:2 "Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is--his good, pleasing and perfect will". That transformation happens when we allow the Spirit of God to work in us to become more Christ-like.

Here is the point of this message: We all, individuals and churches, are dynamic – characterized by constant change, activity or progress. We cannot stay the same and we will not stay the same, we will change. We will change in one of two ways. 1) We will change by the natural evolutionary process or 2) we will change under the power and influence of God.

In the natural evolutionary process we will grow in our minds and bodies however our environment (society) causes us to change. We will become more like society. We will be conformed to the patterns of this world. That applies to us as individuals and churches.

In the transformational process we will grow in our minds and bodies however God causes us to change. We will become more Christ-like. We will be conformed to the patterns of God. We will be less like society. That applies to us as individuals and churches.

Hickory Grove Church will evolve or transform....it all depends on the individuals within. Many churches are evolving into Starbucks. When they have an extra buck, they stop in, kick up their feet and enjoy the delight of their favorite beverage. They can put their headsets on, tune out their neighbors, tap into the internet and do their own thing. They don't have to communicate, they don't have to interact, they have no goal other than to chill out and serve themselves. When people leave, there are no strings attached, they don't have to go back until they are ready to and they are not responsible or accountable to anyone. Many people like Starbucks, not for the coffee, but for the atmosphere. They can even be members and get a "Starbucks Card".

Hickory Grove Church will evolve or transform....it all depends on the individuals within. Many churches are transforming into Houses of Worship. People go on Sundays because it is an opportunity to gather together and give God the Praise and Glory He deserves. People don't give God their extra buck, they give Him the tithe He requires. They tune their hearts into the Holy Spirit and say as Samuel did: "Speak Lord, Your servant is listening". They don't just show up when they are thirsty or need a place to chill, they show up when the doors are open. They bring their Bibles with them because they believe that God speaks to them thru His Word. It does matter when they come back, because other people are counting on them to walk with them on their journey with God. They are not led by the natural forces of society and realize they could be doing other things on Sunday mornings but they have chosen to follow God's leadings. When God said: "You shall have no other God's before me" they realized that anything that kept them from being in God's perfect will was an idol and they chose to put that idol behind them. They put their phones and games away for an hour or two because they are afraid they might miss something that God has just for them. Though the natural evolution of society tells them they are wasting their time, old fashioned and looking for something that is not there, they ignore society.

You see they are transforming. They are putting aside the things of this world for the things of God. Their hearts are not focused on this world but on the world that is coming. The New Heavens and the New Earth, the New Jerusalem, the Soon Coming King are not figments of their imaginations but part of their inner beings. They are not clothed in the latest fashions, but covered in the Blood of the Lamb that still flows from the


These main points were accompanied and supported by several quotations, one being, "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:6
